construction season. Each week,
the weekly report will have updates
on the road construction projects
in Topeka.

Construction highlights:

- Work started back on Clarion
 Woods this week. Limited
 construction this week.
- Work started back on the alley west of KS Avenue off of 1st Street.
- Work started on alley off of Huntoon this week.
- Localized curb replacement projects are underway.



- Emergency concrete street repair on SW29th (Plass to MacVicar) underway.
- Driveway pours into Wheatfield Village (on Fairlawn) underway.

Recent Updates

- There have been 15 broken <u>water mains</u> in March with 117 breaks year to date. At this time last year there were 137 water main breaks.
- Discussions on potential amendments to the CIP occurred at the March 12 City Council meeting and will continue at the March 19 City Council meeting with tentative adoption of the CIP on April 2. More information can be found at:

- The Street Department filled 1,700 potholes this week with 11,579 potholes filled this year.

Pothole Heatmap and Performance Portal

Have you checked out the City of Topeka Performance Portal? The Performance Portal allows you to look at what the City of Topeka is doing with infrastructure, public safety and in neighborhoods - along with several other initiatives.

The street department has been making data based decision making by creating a heat map of potholes. Crews use this heat map to find where the largest concentration of potholes are and fill them in a certain area.

• TSG has been assisting divisions and departments around the city in their efforts in relation to our Team Up, Clean Up initiative. We've provided printed maps, analysis and



guidance in support of their efforts in the field and expect more requests for assistance as this project continues through the end of April.

- WPC collection crews completed work on the Team UP Clean UP project. The pictures attached is the bridge crossing on Fairfax and the sidewalk was overgrown and the inlets needed cleaned. Some of the brush in the channel also was cleaned up.
- All water main valves have been maintained.
- Most hydrants have been pressure checked and maintained.
