o SW 10th and Wanamaker – saw cutting pavement for next removal phase.



o N. Topeka West street and Cherokee bridge improvements are complete.

o Work continuing on 6th Street between Gage and Fairlawn. Sod placement and final lift of asphalt (east end) next week if weather permits. The heavy rain last week caused some delays.

o Full depth pavement patching and 2018 curb replacement underway.

o Work continuing on the 21st and KS Intersection.

o Work started this week on the 29th and Burlingame Intersection.
