


2020 Budget

Road Construction

Department is kicking off
construction season. Each week,
the weekly report will have updates
on the road construction projects
in Topeka.

Construction highlights:

 Work on Clarion Woods, SE Adams, Chesney Park, Arvonia/Winding Road, SW



Gage, SW 29th/McClure and NW Vail continuing.

- Work continuing on Fairlawn between 28th and 29th.
 Localized lane drops and closures will continue over the next few weeks. Tentative schedule to have the concrete work done and asphalt overlay by July 1st.
- Contractor starting on SW
 Gage (I-70 to Emland Drive) on Thursday.
- Traffic signal work at 27th and Burlingame and along SW 17th is underway.

- Getting ready to be the reconstruction of the KS Avenue Bridge (north end).

Recent Updates

- There have been 14 broken <u>water mains</u> in June with 195 breaks year to date. At this time last year there were 256 water main breaks.
- Public Works filled 573 potholes; 25,556 so far this year.
- The Traffic Division is continuing semi-annual traffic signal inspections.
- Neighborhood Relations hosted the Neighborworks Neighborhood University Training and had 35 community participants, 5 from NIA's, 3 city departments and 10 different community and social service agencies.

Ash Street Force Main and Pump Station Project

The City of Topeka Utilities
Department started construction
on the Ash Street Force Main
project on April 15th and is
scheduled to be completed in April
of 2020. The original station was
constructed in 1928 with an
expansion occurring in 1972. The



project consists of construction and installation of a new 48" diameter force main as well as upgrades to the Ash Street Pump Station's existing pumps, gates, instrumentation and controls. There have been two failures in the existing force main, therefore this is a mandated rehabilitation project as part of the Consent Agreement with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

Citizens in the area of the Ash Street Pump Station were notified of the construction by mail this spring. An open house and informational presentation was held on January 24th. The site of construction will have several pieces of large equipment working in the area. The City of Topeka asks that citizens be cautious around the construction work zone. Please follow all temporary construction work zone traffic control which will include detours for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. For more information please contact City
