Construction highlights:

 All lanes of SW Gage (25th to 29th) were opened last week.



- Work is continuing on Fairlawn between 28th and 29th.
 Remaining work on Fairlawn is a localized edge mill and asphalt overlay.
- Traffic signal work at 27th and Burlingame underway (80% complete).
- Work on Clarion Woods, Chesney Park, SE Adams, Arvonia/Winding Road, SW 29th/McClure and NW Vail continuing.
- The city will be replacing the traffic signal and sidewalk ramps at 17th and Topeka Blvd this fall.

Recent Updates


- There have been 6 broken <u>water mains</u> in July with 219 breaks year to date. At this time last year there were 331 water main breaks.
- Public Works filled 461 potholes; 26,870 so far this year.



Utilities STOP floodwall project continues to be delayed.
 Remobilization for critical path item (drilling shafts) requires river level to be below 13 feet.
