1/2 Cent Sales Tax Renewal

In the general election in November there will be a ballot item to *renew* the current 1/2 cent sales tax.

The 1/2 cent sales tax funds **52%** of the forecasted \$24 million spent each year on street projects.

The citywide sales tax program uses about \$14 million raised annually through a 0.5 percent retailers' tax, also known as a sales tax. The funds are used exclusively for costs of maintenance and improvements of existing City of Topeka streets, gutters, curbs, sidewalks, alleys and street lighting.

Road Construction Update

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

The image on the right is a list of featured road construction projects for 2018.

The I-470/Huntoon/Arvonia intersection is now open!

Work continuing on:

- Microsurfacing- Project is completing its seventh week. Two crews are working and the majority of microsurfacing should be completed within the next few weeks. Restriping starting late this week.
- SW 37th between Burlingame and Kirklawn- Milling and base patching completed early in the week. Asphalt overlay started on Thursday and is scheduled to be completed on Saturday.



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- Clarion Woods- Pavement removal and asphalt placement occurring this week.
- SW Huntoon/Arvonia- Ribbon cutting held on Thursday for the opening of the I-470 ramp, Huntoon (east) and Arvonia. Retaining walls are under construction up the hill to the west to Executive Drive.
- A project to help with drainage at three intersections (Clay/4th, Clay/5th, and Fillmore/5th) is underway.
- SW 6th between Gage and Fairlawn- Contractor placed asphalt this week.
- SW Gage between 21st and 25th- Contractor completing pavement patching in the southbound lanes. Working on option to complete mill and overlay within a 24-hour complete shutdown of this section of SW Gage.
- SE Adams between 29th and 33rd-Contractor poured sections of concrete pavement between the Post Office and 29th.
- 21st and Kansas- Northbound lanes of KS Ave, north of 21st, were poured this week.
- 29th and Burlingame- Work continuing on the southeast quadrant.

Street Project Startup and Major Phase Changes:

- SW 29th Fairlawn to I-470 will start in September.
- Two alley projects will start within the next two weeks.
- Startup of the two mill and overlay projects.

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Recent Updates

- There have been 18 <u>water main breaks</u> in September with 621 breaks year to date. Last year at this time there were 266 total breaks.
- The Planning Department has launched anew "<u>Building Permit Map</u>" on the City's front page. If you ever wanted to know "what is being built there?" this new interactive online map allows you to search all residential and commercial building permits by dates.
- The Topeka Planning Commission with hold a public hearing Monday, September 17 to consider adopting new architectural design standards for commercial buildings as well as some enhancements to landscape regulations. The design standards would be the first of their kind for Topeka beyond historic districts and downtown. They are part of a series of "Visual Code Updates" to improve the aesthetic appeal of the city's built environment. The Planning Commission will consider making a recommendation to the Governing Body for ultimate approval. <figure></figure>	The Planning Department tracks the total is building permits issued on an annual basis Topeka. Total building permits issued is an development activity. Data is projected through 2018. From 2017 to 2018, total building permits are projected to decrease 0.9% (448 vs. 444). An estimated increase of 17.7% (232 vs. 273) in the total number of residential permits would not offset a 20.8% decrease (216 vs. 171) in the total ounber of commercial permits . The Planning Department tracks the square footage and value of all building permits. Both building square footage and building value can be used to better understand the scale of investment per building permit issued within the City of Topeka. From 2017 to 2018, total building square footage is projected to decrease by 65%, (4,275,853. H. vs. 1,466,465 ft.). The value of building permits is projected to decrease by 33.7% (5154,111,221 vs. 302,167.753). The table below and man		s in the City of

Development and Growth Management Report

Planning released the August, 2018 Development and Growth Management (DGM) Report which can be found at <u>www.topeka.org/planning</u>

Highlights include:

• Total building permits for new construction or remodel are projected to be 2% higher than last year. Compared to 2017, residential permits are projected to increase by 21% while commercial permits would drop 18% by year end.

• 93 new residential units have been permitted for construction year to date.

55% of all new dwelling units
 within Shawnee County have been

built within the City of Topeka year to date compared to 48% for 2017.

• Total building permit values are projected to decrease 34% by year end compared to last year which would be the lowest valuation totals since 2014.

• The 3 highest valued permits issued last month include:

o Hills Pet Nutrition, 320 NE Crane (\$1.2M)

o Bajillion Agency, 100 S. Kansas (\$1.0M)

o Addition, 4400 SW Pinebrook Ln. (\$750k)

Water Line Replacement

A new water line is being installed at SE 29th and Wittenberg Road.

16" PVC water main pipe is being laid to the east of the road and 12" pipe is being laid to the west of the road. This project is 30% complete.
